

Hydro One One Awards

The One Awards are comprised of three awards that celebrate outstanding young people who demonstrate the traits that make us the innovative, customer-focused, and diverse organization we are. In addition to a \$5,000 award, recipients of these awards are offered a paid work term with Hydro One.

All interested applicants must complete and submit the proper documentation by November 1.



William Peyton Hubbard Memorial Award

Hydro One is committed to supporting outstanding Black undergraduate students attending an Ontario college or university studying energy industry related disciplines. This award is named after William Peyton Hubbard, who was instrumental in the development and public control of hydroelectric power in Ontario. The son of a freed slave from Virginia, he was Toronto's first Black Alderman, Controller and Acting Mayor in the early part of the 20th century.

Leonard S. (Tony) Mandamin Award

Hydro One is committed to supporting Indigenous students who are interested in pursuing careers within the electricity sector. The award is named after the Honourable Justice Leonard S. (Tony) Mandamin who during his distinguished legal career, focused his legal practice on representing First Nations, Indigenous organizations and individuals. The award is granted to Indigenous students studying in energy industry related disciplines at a recognized university or community college.

Women in Engineering Award

Hydro One has a history of fostering the professional growth of women in engineering, creating mutually beneficial opportunities for career development. Part of this support has been this award that empowers young women wishing to embark on a career in Engineering.
