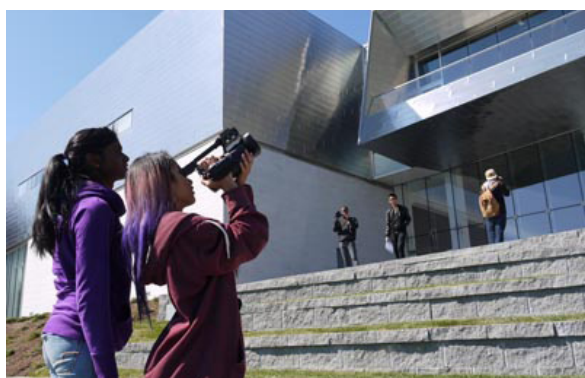

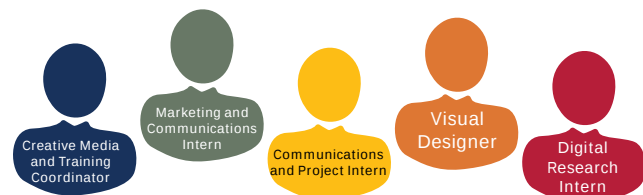
ELIGIBILITY
