Applying to and Navigating Graduate Studies

Why a Professional Master's in Education?

Our fully online, part-time Professional Master of Education (PME) program is designed for educators and other professionals who want to take their career to the next level by exploring educational theory in relation to their practice and the broader field of education. The PME program provides students with the unique opportunity to focus their graduate learning in a chosen concentration of study, apply that learning to solve problems of practice and effect change in their professional context, and broaden their understanding of enduring, contemporary, and emerging educational theories, approaches, and mindsets in relation to diverse professional contexts. The PME program attracts students from a variety of settings—schools, governments, universities, professions, and people in career transitions—enriching everyone's experience.

Program Structure

The PME program offers a flexible and personalized approach to post-graduate studies in education. All PME courses run asynchronously online, which means professionals can participate from anywhere in the world without disrupting their busy schedules.

- Students enrolled in the PME program must complete a total of 10 courses, 5 required and 5 elective.
- Learning culminates in a capstone project.
- Courses are offered four terms throughout the year: Fall, Winter, Spring, and Summer.
- Courses are 10 weeks in Fall and Winter and 7 weeks

- Courses are approximately 36 hours online and 70-100 hours independently.

Required Courses

All PME students are required to take the following courses:

- PME 894 Introduction to Educational Fieldwork
- PME 896 Capstone

In addition, PME students choose one of the following concentrations and take all 3 courses in their chosen concentration:

- Assessment & Evaluation
- Classroom Specialist
- Educational Administration
- Global Education
- Indigenous Education
- Literacy Education

Elective Courses(5)

Students must also take 5 elective courses. The breadth of elective options allows students to customize

a learning portfolio that supports their professional context. Electives include:

- PME 800 Self-Regulated Inquiry and Learning
- PME 801 Cultivating Creativity
- PME 803 Organizational Leadership
- PME 810 Integrated Planning, Instruction, and Assessment
- PME 811 Innovation in Teacher and Learning
- PME 814 Problem Based Learning
- PME 815 Digital Literacy
- PME 878 Experiential Practice in Education
- Students may also choose courses from outside their designated concentration as electives.

Ladder Your Credentials

Applicants to the Graduate Diploma in Education (GDE) and the Professional Master of Education (PME) programs who have completed a post-graduate certificate through Queen's Continuing Teacher Education (CTE) or Professional Studies (PS) as part of the ladder option qualify for advanced standing.

Application FAQs

What do I need to know to Apply?

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- A baccalaureate degree from a recognized university.
- Statement of Interest.
- Graduation with a B- graduating average or higher (70% graduating average or a ranking in the top third of the graduating class where number grades are not available).
- Under exceptional circumstances, consideration will be given to highly motivated individuals with relevant field experience who do not meet the B- requirement.
- If English is not a first language, nor was the language of instruction in undergraduate studies, prospective students must meet English language proficiency requirements in writing, speaking, reading, and listening as part of the application process, and before final acceptance is granted, as per School of Graduate Studies and Postdoctoral Affairs' regulations.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

- 2 academic references (or 2 professional references if last degree was completed more than 5 years prior).
- As part of the online application and application fee, applicants will be required to submit official transcripts from all universities attended (except Queen's), and 2 academic references.

Application Process

As part of the online application and application fee, applicants will be required to submit official transcripts from all universities attended (except Queen's) and 2 references (professional preferred, but academic will be accepted).

The online application form includes two spaces for reference contact information.

Referees are notified that you want them to provide a reference for you by email after you have submitted your online application, so please submit your application at least two weeks before the application deadline and be sure to include the correct email addresses of your referees on your online application. Applications will not be deemed complete and will not be reviewed by the admissions committee until all listed references are received.

In addition to the online application and application fee, applicants are required to submit official transcripts (envelopes from the institution cannot be opened) from all universities attended except for Queen's.
