What is QUIP?

The Queen's Undergraduate Internship Program (QUIP) provides students with a 12-16 month work experience. QUIP internships are paid, professionally supervised, career-related positions offering students the opportunity to learn about current practices, advances, and technologies in various sectors and industries.

The program is open to domestic and international undergraduate students in Smith Engineering, the Faculty of Arts and Science (BAH and BScH degree programs), the School of Computing, and the Faculty of Health Sciences (BHsc).

Does Queen's Have CO-OP?

At Queen's, we call it an internship. Our 12-16 month internships give you the chance to take on meaningful projects and see them through from start to finish. With this extended time in one role, you can make a lasting impact in the workplace, develop strong professional relationships, and gain in-depth skills that set you apart.



When Can I Participate?

Students can register in QUIP after completing their first year at Queen's. Internships typically occur after 2nd or 3rd year and are generally 12-months in length with some opportunities for 16-months starting in spring. You are not committed to a specific start date, but students are encouraged to register early to start looking and keep options open.



How Can I Get an Internship?

We work directly with employers to post their internship positions to the QUIP online job board. You can apply to these postings, or work with an Internship Coordinator to pursue other eligible opportunities not posted on the QUIP job board. We offer support to students searching for internships through online modules, drop-in advising, and 1-on-1 appointments. Students who put in the effort will increase their chances of securing an internship.

What Field Can I Work In?

Internship opportunities span a wide range of fields, including engineering, finance, tech, healthcare, education, government, communications, and more. Our team is constantly collaborating with new employers to expand the number and variety of internships available. If you are looking for something specific that we don't currently have postings for, we will support you in a tailored internship search.
