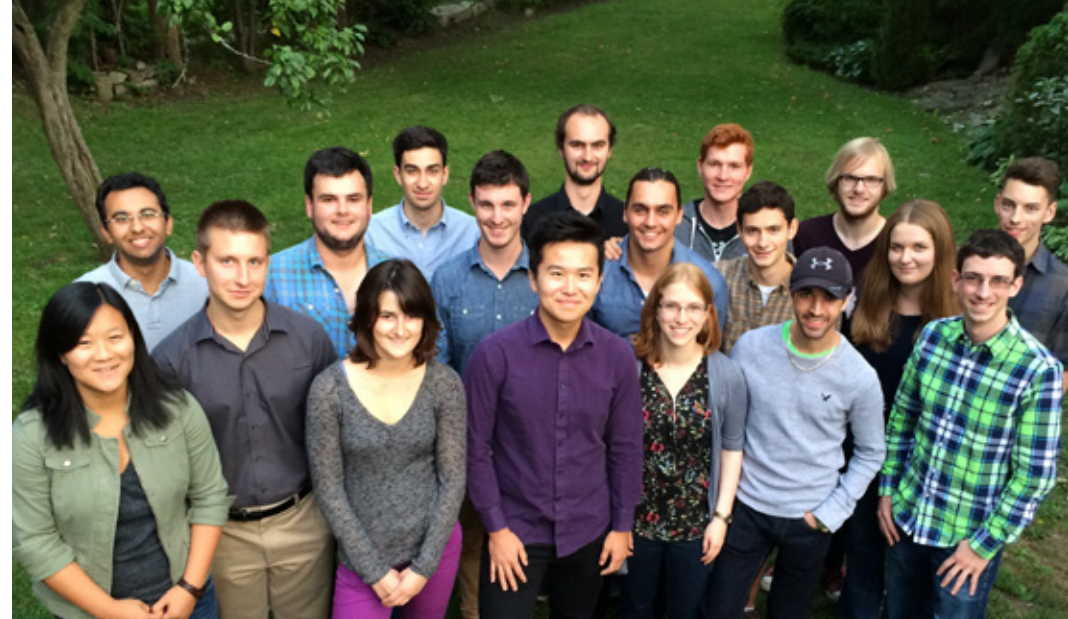

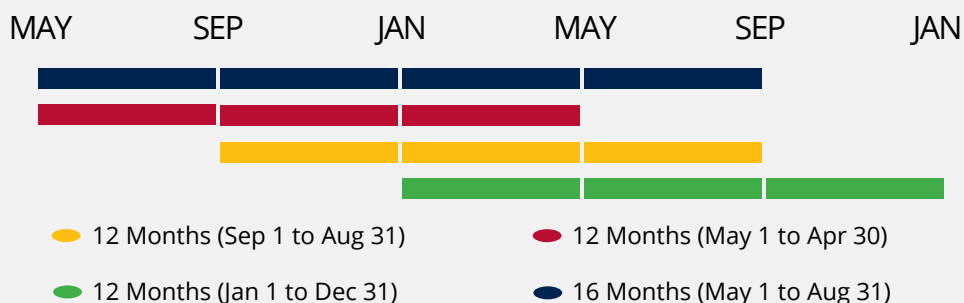


WHAT IS QUIP?

The Queen's Undergraduate Internship Program (QUIP) provides you with the opportunity to participate in a 12-16 month work experience. QUIP internships are paid, professionally supervised, career-related positions designed to offer second or third year students the opportunity to learn about current advances, practices and technologies in various sectors and industries.

The program is open to domestic and international undergraduate students in the Faculty of Engineering and Applied Science, Faculty of Arts and Science (BAH and BScH degree programs), School of Computing, and Faculty of Health Sciences (BHSc).

HOW DO I FIND AN INTERNSHIP?

We work directly with employers to post their internship positions to the QUIP online job board. You can apply to these postings or work with an Internship Coordinator to pursue other eligible opportunities outside the QUIP Job Board.

HOW DO I REGISTER?

Go to the [Career Services Website](#) for full instructions. You will get permission from your department, and then complete a registration form on MyCareer.

DOES QUEEN'S HAVE CO-OP?

At Queen's, we call it an internship. Our internship program offers a 12-16 month, paid, full-time work term typically after second or third year. Some advantages are:

- 1 You have more time to make a meaningful contribution and learn in-depth skills compared to a 4-month term.
- 2 If you find an internship outside of the Kingston area, you only need to move one time, as opposed to moving multiple times for a series of positions.
- 3 You complete only one internship search, as opposed to searching for multiple short-term positions.

WHO GETS INTERNSHIPS?

We offer support to students searching for internships through workshops, drop-in advising, and one-on-one appointments. Students who commit to the search and put in the effort will increase their chances of securing an internship.

WHAT ARE THE OPTIONS?

There are many jobs in different fields. If you want to find something specific that we don't have postings for yet, we will work with you to find a suitable opportunity.

WHEN SHOULD I GO? WHERE CAN I GO?

Students typically participate after second or third year. You will then return to your studies at Queen's to complete your final academic requirements and apply your new workplace knowledge and skills.

There are positions at Queen's and other employers in Kingston, across Ontario and Canada. You can also do an internship internationally.
